## COVID-19 TRANSYLVANIA COUNTY UPDATE TO CITIZENS #10 - March 26, 2020

Emergency Management and Public Health Continue to work with state and federal systems to keep information current and to confirm plans to respond to local needs. Dupont and Gorges are both closed to the public and signs will be placed on roadways entering the county. All legal options, including shelter in place, are on the table for discussion to slow the spread.

Make sure you limit your trips away from home to those only necessary and stay home, particularly if you fall in the at-risk category as defined by the Centers for Disease Control.

CDC and NCDHHS have revised their guidelines for citizens who are sick. New instructions include to call your doctor first. Only plan to come into the doctor's office if you are in the at risk category or if you are experiencing severe symptoms. Most people will be able to recover at home and will not need testing.
