The JCPC anticipates funds from the NC Dept. of Public Safety Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention in the amount stated above to fund the program types specified below. Such programs will serve delinquent and at-risk youth for the state fiscal year 2025-2027 beginning on, or after, July 1, 2025. The use of these funds in this county requires a local match in the amount specified above. The county can approve programs for 1- or 2-year funding awards, dependent on county approval and programs meeting all requirements.

Based on identified needed programs and possible gaps in the service continuum, the following program types

Proposed program services should target the following risk factors for delinquency or repeat delinquency: Prior referrals, known use of alcohol and/or illegal drugs, school behavior problems, lack of pro-social peers, inadequate parental supervision

Proposed services should address the following concerns as reported in the Youth Assessment Screening Instrument (YAS) for adjudicated youth:

Peer Domain: Increased number of youth associating with others involved in delinquent activity

Individual Domain: Increased rate of abuse/neglect, lack of support for victims of abuse/neglect, substance abuse

Family Domain: Conflict within the home, inadequate supervision at home, family substance use, family criminality

School Domain: High levels of school behavior problems, functioning below grade level

Applicants are being sought that are able to address items below:

- 1. Program services compatible with research that are shown to be effective with juvenile offenders.
- 2. Program services are outcome-based.
- 3. The program has an evaluation component.
- 4. Program services detect gang participation and divert individuals from gang participation.
- 5. Awareness of and sensitivity to Racial Ethnic Disparity that exists in the County.
- 6. Programs are encouraged to provide effective programming that includes restorative justice practices.

Only local public agencies, 501c3 non-profit corporations and local housing authorities will be considered for funding.
