## COVID-19 TRANSYLVANIA COUNTY UPDATE TO CITIZENS #4 - March 18, 2020

There are currently no confirmed cases in Transylvania County. Emergency Management and Public Health Continue to work with state and federal systems to keep information current and to confirm plans to respond should a local outbreak occur. Please consider the guidance on social distancing and limit time in public to the extent possible to help slow down the rate of potential exposure.

Governor Cooper has revised recommendations to limit gatherings to no more than 50 people. As of today, all restaurants and bars must be take out or delivery only. \*Transylvania County library will be closing at 5:30 today and will remain closed until further notice. Curbside pickup will be provided Monday-Saturday from 10 am-5 pm. \*WCCA has suspended Lunch Plus for Seniors at Silvermont and Quebec; however, they will be providing meals to go and will be offering delivery in partnership with Transylvania County DSS and Transylvania County transit starting today for Lunch Plus clients.

\*WCCA Tigertown thrift shop is closed at this time.

\*Pardee has opened a free testing site to the public at the Blue Ridge Community College Flat Rock Campus open daily from 9 am to 7 pm. You must meet criteria to be tested. Please call their hotline at 828-694-8048 before you go.

\*Dominion Energy has suspended disconnections for non-payment during the present emergency. They are reviewing other measures we can take to make a difference. Residential customers recently disconnected due to non-payment, should contact us and we will work with then to reconnect service. \*God's Way Food Pantry in Balsam Grove will operate this Saturday, March 21, 10-12noon with a drive up system for clients. If you are ill please call 884-7793 on Saturday Morning beginning at 9 am to arrange or someone to pick up for you.

\*Staying home can be isolating! The North Carolina Baptist Aging Ministry is available for those who need to talk. Call 866-758-4673

\*Transylvania County Department of Social Services is working on a partnership with local nonprofits to host a pop-up food distribution location out in the more rural areas of community with the ability to help people access benefits that they may now need. More information to come!

\*Transylvania County Transportation is currently operating as normal. Riders may call 884-3203 by 10:00 am the day before to request transportation.

\*Sharing House remains open for these essential services, emergency food (one week supply for size of household) and crisis financial assistance. Please call Sharing House at 884-2866 for appointments only, and neighbors in need will be served either over the phone for financial or at the side-door in the alleyway with pre-packed food orders

\*The Transylvania Economic Alliance is coordinating with the Brevard/Transylvania County Chamber of Commerce, Tourism Development Authority, Heart of Brevard, and Small Business Center with Blue Ridge Community College on a coordinated outreach to the business community with information specific to workplace safety standards and recommended actions to help reduce the long term impact to each businesses workforce. We have developed a webpage on our site which contains best practices and useful links. We are also developing a business survey in an effort to gather information and triage the most pressing issues with employers and their individual team members. The business survey will be made available on our website, social media and e-newsletter platforms within the next 24 hours. Staff is also reaching out individually to businesses to assess needs.
